Liability for Environmental Harm to the Global Commons

Neil Craik, Tara Davenport, and Ruth Mackenzie

In their recent book published by Cambridge University Press (2023) on *Liability for Environmental Harm to the Global Commons*, Neil Craik, Tara Davenport, and Ruth Mackenzie examine emerging and prospective international legal rules addressing liability for environmental harm to areas beyond national jurisdiction. By exploring the constituent elements of liability regimes such as the definition and valuation of environmental damage; the allocation of liability; the standard of liability; standing to bring claims; access to remedies; insurance and compensation funds and how these elements have been implemented in existing legal regimes in the deep seabed, the Antarctic, and the high seas, the book highlights key challenges for states in devising effective liability regimes and outlines possible ways forward.

COP28: THE KEY TAKEAWAYS

COP28 - the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Dubai, UAE in 2023 - was a pivotal COP in which Parties must increase their ambition and action. This COP provided an opportunity to identify a worldwide solution for limiting global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius, to develop ambitious NDCs due in 2025, and to expedite the green transition to meet the Paris Agreement objectives. Did COP28 meet all of these aims? This webinar will feature international climate change and environmental law experts assessing lessons learned from COP28 and the first global stocktake, as well as highlighting developing-country perspectives.
